Voters Meeting after Worship 12/05/23:

Meeting was called to order by President Brons at 11:52 am. Voters present were Brian, Crystal, Bob, Carol, Todd, Jerry, Dolly, Russ, Denny, Connie, and also Pastor Jacobsen. We were also blessed with guests John and Kaitlyn O'Neal who expressed they wish to join the Voters Assembly. Pastor opened the meeting with Prayer.

Pastors report- we welcome John and Caitlyn who joined Concordia a few weeks ago. Motion was made and seconded to officially place them into membership, motion carried. With Christmas Eve on Sunday this year we will just have our two evening services, Lessons and Carols at Concordia at 5 pm and Candlelight Worship at Trinity at 7 pm. Christmas Day service will be at Concordia at 9 am. Pastor will be gone after Christmas services until January 4th. Also mentioned were some youth events being planned that will hopefully be done in the New Year. Minutes of the last meeting were given, motion was made by Russ seconded by Jerry to accept the minutes as read, motion carried. Treasurer's report was given, motion was made by Den seconded by Carol to accept the Treasurer's report. Motion carried. Trustee's report- it was mentioned it would be good to have a nicer table to put up front for placement of Urns and or pictures when needed, possibilities will be looked into. It was discussed to raise the amount that the Trustees could authorize spending on needed projects higher than \$100 so Voters meetings would not have to be called to authorize. Amount suggested was maybe \$600. It was noted such a change would require a revising the constitution. Carol will get a copy of the constitution to Denny to review process needed for such an amendment. Todd mentioned the quote for needed changes and repairs to solve the problem of water entering the building was for approx. \$30,000. It was noted we may need to get an updated quote to be sure of amount, and that we need to decide what we want to do and where funds for such could come from. Thanks were extended to Jerry for replacing the closure mechanism on the North entry door. Do to past vandalism of the breaking of some of our basement windows, and the recent vandalism of our custodian's car windows being broken out, Todd reported information he gathered regarding installation of an exterior camera surveillance system. Bid for a seven camera system with monitor and digital recorder was presented from Smart Solutions Inc of Milford for \$4253.97. Motion was made by Dolly seconded by Carol to go with the bid and have the project done, motion carried. Education report- Sunday School has been going well. New business- John and Caitlyn were thanked for their expressed desire to join the Voter's, and all were reminded that to join simply requires attendance of two meetings and stating the desire to join for official approval. Dolly presented a document received for us to set our 2024 commitment for giving to IDW. Motion was made by Brian seconded by Russ to stay at our current level of \$70 per month, with the option to give more if wanted after new budget is set, motion carried. It was mentioned that we also need to look at our commitment to start giving again to other mission projects we had done in the past which were suspended during the Covid

pandemic.

Such will be discussed after the upcoming budget meeting of the dual parish committee to propose the new 2024 budget. Next meeting is scheduled for January 28, 2024 following worship, for dealing with setting the new budget. Motion was made by Den seconded by Dolly to adjourn, motion carried, meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer at 12:40 pm. Dennis Stahly – Secretary

Denny mentioned after a first review that there were some other items on the constitution that we may need to think about revising or re-implementing. Pastor Jacobsen also mentioned that constitutional changes also need to be submitted to the Synod for approval. Secretary Stahly will go through the constitution and list items to consider at future meetings.
